Thanksgiving Communion Liturgy

We come together to lift our hearts to you in thanksgiving for the gift of reconciliation, healing and new life that we have through your gift of Jesus.

Jesus came and taught us to love you, O God with all that is within us. He came and taught us the truth about you. He came to fulfill our traditions and to let go of ourselves. He died on a cross for the thing that plagues us, sin and separation, fulfilling your love for us through his resurrection and reconciling us to you forever.

Holy One, we give thanks for this living bread and this life saving cup as we proclaim the mystery of our faith in Christ our Lord.

Creator God, let your Spirit move among us. Come upon these gifts of the earth and make them holy. We thank you for allowing us to eat from your table. We worship you in this meal and receive these gifts from your loving hand.
