



Old Testament Reading: Habakkuk 3:17-19

The fig tree has no buds, the vines bear no harvest, the olive oil yield fail, the fields produce no yield, the sheep vanish from the fold, and there are no cattle in the stalls. But I will rejoice in YHWH, I will exult in God my Savior. My sovereign YHWH is my strength! God makes my feet as agile as a deer's, and teaches me to walk on my high places.

Gospel Reading: Matthew 6:25-33

That's why I tell you not to worry about your livelihood, what you are to eat or drink or use for clothing. Isn't life more than just food? Isn't the body more than just clothes? "Look at the birds in the sky. They don't sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet our God in heaven feeds them. Aren't you more important than they? Which of you by worrying can add a moment to your lifespan? And why be anxious about clothing? Learn a lesson from the way the wildflowers grow. They don't work; they don't spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in full splendor was arrayed like one of these. If God can clothe in such splendor the grasses of the field, which bloom today and are thrown on the fire tomorrow, won't God do so much more for you—you who have so little faith? "Stop worrying, then, over questions such as, 'What are we to eat,' or 'what are we to drink,' or 'what are we to wear?' Those without faith are always running after these things. Thanksgiving Communion Liturgy by Pastor Nora Pederberg

Voice 1: We praise you Creator God for all of your creation. In the beginning, you created the world and all that is in it. From the rising sun in the East, to the soft rains of the South, to the setting sun in the West, to the dancing lights of the North. From the depths of our hearts we give you thanks.

Voice 2: We come together to lift our hearts to you in thanksgiving for the gift of reconciliation, healing and new life that we have through your gift of Jesus. Jesus came and taught us to love you, with all that is within us. He came and taught us the truth about you. He came to fulfill our traditions and to let go of ourselves. He died on a cross for the thing that plagues us, sin and separation, fulfilling your love for us through his resurrection and reconciling us to you forever.

Voice 1: Before your Son, our Lord Jesus, was given up to death, a death he freely accepted, he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples and said, take this all of you and eat it. This is my body given for you. When his supper was ended, he took the cup. Again, he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples and said: Take this, all of you, and drink it. This is the cup of my life, the new and everlasting covenant, given for you and for all. Do this in memory of me.

All: Holy One, we give thanks for this living bread and this life saving cup as we proclaim the mystery of our faith.

Voice 2: Creator God, let your Spirit move among us. Come upon these gifts of the earth and make them holy. We thank you for allowing us to eat from your table. We worship you in this meal and receive these gifts from your loving hand. Guide our journeys that we may walk your path in truth and kindness. Bless our intentions that we will always reach out with love to one another. Bless us with the wisdom to follow your example, so

that we may have the courage and humility we need to face the sunrise and the sunset as we strive to complete our circle.


ALL: Through Jesus, with Jesus and in Jesus and the unity of the Spirit who draws us together; all glory be to God our Creator and Redeemer.

- 2. *Still working on a new janitor*. Trustees purchased Roomba to do the vacuuming which saves janitorial time. They will be replacing all church light bulbs to LED.
- 3. Financials we took in \$182,670.21 compared to \$181,733.24 for a net gain of \$936.97. In 2021 we paid Loretta an additional \$1,363 as an honorarium for lost wages in 2020. Recommendation is that we related these numbers and recommend an analysis of the profit and loss numbers from the last two years to provide some insight as to if this is an accurate portrayal of our finances in the last two years and look for recommendations coming out of that. Matthew suggested either Christy or Jim for that analysis.

A message from Mennonite Church Canada's executive ministers:

We are responding to inquiries from constituents regarding religious exemption from COVID-19 vaccines. For a religious exemption to be granted, rationale for exemption must be clearly indicated within our sacred texts or confessional statements.

We wish to clarify that there is nothing in the Bible, in our historic confessions of faith, in our theology or in our ecclesiology that justifies granting a religious exemption from vaccinations against COVID-19.

We have heard concerns from some members of our constituency regarding the vaccines. However, we do not believe these concerns justify an exemption from COVID-19 vaccinations on religious grounds from within a Mennonite faith tradition.

From the earliest biblical writings, in the words of Jesus Christ and in ecclesial writings since Jesus' ascension, the command to love God and love our neighbour is paramount. Vaccinations allow us to live out this command. Not only do they reduce the severity of symptoms for those who become infected with COVID-19, but they reduce the risk of spreading the virus to those around us. We also note that individuals should make personal health care decisions based on advice given by their doctors.

We pray for unity among us in the Spirit of Christ, who calls us into this life of love, especially for our most vulnerable neighbours.
