

Prelude


Welcome, Announcements

Focus statement: Singing together causes great joy and jubilation. But, even more, our hearts exult and swell as we imagine God singing over us.

Call to Worship: (adapted from Zephaniah 3:14-20)

- L: Rejoice in the Lord always, and again I say: Rejoice!
- P: Shout for joy, rejoice with all your heart!
- L: God sings over you. Fear not, for God is in. your midst.
- P: Shout for joy, rejoice with all your heart!
- L: Sing praises to God—shout aloud and sing for joy.
- P: God is in our midst.
- L: We listen.
- P: We strain to grasp the sound of God's song.



Advent Candle Litany

- L: We light a candle of joy. And we imagine:
- P: Jubilation! Rejoicing! Do not fear!
- L: We light the candle and join in God's song, singing loudly, singing fiercely, singing together.
- P: Imagine that ... we are God's wonders, blessed wonders.

Confession and Assurance: Even our wildest imaginations cannot grasp the immense beauty of God. This is a true confession. We are small, God is bigger. We will never fully know, but we are fully known. We catch glimpses of God's magnificence, and we accept that it is only that, a glimpse. God invites us to accept our smallness— while we join the awesome song of God's joy. Today, instead of the usual words of confession, we invite the church to be immersed and "covered" in song. Over our heads there is music. As we await the birth of Jesus, we do well to joyfully give ourselves to the One who imagines the divine in the form of a child. Dare to imagine!





Advent Banner created by Lois Siemens

Dare to Imagine - This year's paper banner uses layered text, images created and found and an abundance of green to try to depict the theme. A Masters level project revealed that when people have to put a colour to God the majority chose green. Notice the words. The letters are made up of signs in and around Osler. See if you recognize them. I wanted to remind us that God was born into a place and time and moved out from there. Our work is to bring Jesus from the church building into Osler and the world and this takes daring and imagination.

Advent 1: God's goodness comes to us daily. Notice the sunrises and sunsets hanging alongside the banner. Each small watercolour starts with a tree, beginning with Spring and ending in the Winter of our lives. How has God's goodness come to you in the sunrises and sunsets of your life: At the end of Advent, don't be surprised if God's goodness follows you home.

Advent 2: God's Embrace: This image is a photocopy of a needlework piece done by Elizabeth (Liz) Wenger in 1987 called "For God so loved the world." Liz is a disabled artist and lies on her back with the screen above her pushing the needle through while someone on the other side pushes it back through to Liz. An embrace encloses. It can be soft or strong. The memory of the touch stays in our bodies. You might have noticed the backwards "E" on the title. One of the ways I imagine God hugs us in the Biblical text is through inclusion. A plain example is Psalm 8 which starts and ends with the same line. Today's example is Luke 3:1-6. It begins

with a list of the political power of the day which is powerless to save and the end line proclaims the true power - salvation of God.

Advent 3: God's Song floats throughout the banner. Music has the power to move our imaginations as poetry, rhythm, breath and memory come together. I like to imagine the morning stars singing together at the world's creation. How do you imagine that sound and what was the effect? How does God sing to you? In C.S. Lewis' book "The Magicians Nephew" Aslan creates the new world with song.
