Easter Sunday – April 17, 2022

The Burial of Christ: Luke 23:44-46, 50-54 (*Inclusive Version*) It was about noon, and darkness fell on the whole land until three in the afternoon, because of an eclipse of the sun. Then the curtain in the sanctuary was torn in two, and Jesus uttered a loud cry and said, "Abba, into your hands I commit my spirit." Saying this, Jesus breathed for the last time. There was a member of the Sanhedrin named Joseph, who had not consented to their action. Joseph was from Arimathea and lived in anticipation of the reign of God. He approached Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Joseph took the body down, wrapped it in fine linen and laid it in a tomb cut out of rock, where no one had yet been laid. It was Preparation Day, and the Sabbath was about to begin.

First Gospel Reading: Luke 24:1-12

On the first day of the week, at the first sign of dawn, the women came to the tomb bringing the spices they had prepared. They found the stone rolled back from the tomb; but when they entered the tomb, they didn't find the body of Jesus. While they were still at a loss over what to think of this, two figures in dazzling garments stood beside them. Terrified, the women bowed to the ground. The two said to them, "Why do you search for the Living One among the dead? Jesus is not here; Christ has risen. Remember what Jesus said to you while still in Galilee-that the Chosen One must be delivered into the hands of sinners and be crucified, and on the third day would rise again." With this reminder, the words of Jesus came back to them. When they had returned from the tomb, they told all these things to the Eleven and the others. The women were Mary of Magdala, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James. The other women with them also told the apostles, but the story seemed like nonsense and they refused to believe them. Peter, however, got up and ran to the tomb. He stooped down, but he could see nothing but the wrappings. So he went away, full of amazement at what had occurred.

OMC MDS trip July 3-8 at Monte Lake, BC with travel dates July 1/2/9 with Pastor Patty. Interested participants can receive financial assistance for food/gas or train. In August 2021, the White Rock fire destroyed 28 structures at Monte Lake, B.C. It was one of about 1,600 fires in the province during last year's fire season. In collaboration with the B.C. unit, we are rebuilding up to five new homes in the small community. Many volunteers of all skill levels will be needed for this project, which will run from May until fall. Monte Lake is located about 50 kilometres from Kamloops in B.C.'s interior with camping options at Monte Lake Provincial Park.
