# OMC 90 Story by Jacob Friesen (edited):

As for 'particular memories', one which rather typifies the attitudinal changes that have evolved over the span of a century, still comes to mind on occasion. Osler church members had learned to love their sanctuary along with the furnishings and, in particular, the Bible and the pulpit, which was held to be more than a utilitarian lectern. Even elders of the church would out of respect, revere its significance by standing beside the pulpit when making announcements or directing procedures. I seem to remember there was a large 'pulpit Bible' that never left its rather sacred placement on the pulpit. Even our young people sensed the intended solemnity and respectfully stood to one side when presenting assigned roles in the order of service.

While at the time of it's happening, I along with others thought the criticism to be over the top, when during a Spring Cleaning bee of the church, an offended elder reprimanded volunteering church young people for carrying the church pulpit into the storage shed in the church yard; intending wisely to spare the fixture from soiling. Both parties were actually right, but their respective motivations articulate generational dimensions we still need to learn from. The essential learning I've taken from that long ago actuality has left an indelible impression of sacred caution that still instructs my mind when 'handling the Word of Truth'.

7-10 Because of the sacrifice of the Messiah, his blood poured out on the altar of the Cross, we're a free people—free of penalties and punishments chalked up by all our misdeeds. And not just barely free, either. Abundantly free! He thought of everything, provided for everything we could possibly need, letting us in on the plans he took such delight in making. He set it all out before us in Christ, a longrange plan in which everything would be brought together and summed up in him, everything in deepest heaven, everything on planet earth.

11-12 It's in Christ that we find out who we are and what we are living for. Long before we first heard of Christ and got our hopes up, he had his eye on us, had designs on us for glorious living, part of the overall purpose he is working out in everything and everyone. 13-14 It's in Christ that you, once you heard the truth and believed it (this Message of your salvation), found yourselves home free signed, sealed, and delivered by the Holy Spirit. This signet from God is the first installment on what's coming, a reminder that we'll get everything God has planned for us, a praising and glorious life.
