## **OMC 90 Story by Adeline Cox:**

Sunday School has been a big part of my OMC experience. It was bringing our son, Chris, here to attend Sunday School that first started our weekly trips from Warman to Osler.

In the 1980s, in the old church building, we had many children's Sunday School classes downstairs. Who can forget the small wooden tables and benches in plain wooden walled classrooms.

I remember the flannel cutout Biblical characters who moved on a flannel board to bring stories of Jesus to life by imaginative teachers like Joanne Friesen, Edna Zacharias and Leanne Friesen.

In earlier days, a teacher committed to classes for the whole year. For a couple of years, in a very small classroom upstairs in the peak of the old church, I taught a class of only 3 Grade 6 students: Rachelle Wall, Raina Boldt and Logan Regier. I loved those years. Sometimes there was only 1 or 2 of these students who made it to church on a Sunday, but that provided good opportunities for quiet discussions, as these youth often came up with challenging topics.

Music was and still is a huge part of OMC life. We have been blessed with concerts, choirs, passionate offertory pieces, guest singers and the joy of watching our beginner students cut their teeth on instrumental and vocal solos. We still start children's Sunday School with singing – lovely and enthusiastic songs.

But for many of us, the highlight of OMC services every year is December 24<sup>th</sup> and the children's Sunday School pageant and program; with all the young excited, shiny candlelit faces and shy verses recited for proud parents and grandparents. Cap that with carol singing and a long-held tradition of singing *Friedensfurst*, and you have some Holy Night magic.

## **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: 1 Kings 19:8-13** (The Message)

<sup>8-9</sup> He got up, ate and drank his fill, and set out. Nourished by that meal, he walked forty days and nights, all the way to the mountain of God, to Horeb. When he got there, he crawled into a cave and went to sleep. Then the word of GoD came to him: "So Elijah, what are you doing here?" <sup>10</sup> "I've been working my heart out for the GoD-of-the-Angel-Armies," said Elijah. "The people of Israel have abandoned your covenant, destroyed the places of worship, and murdered your prophets. I'm the only one left, and now they're trying to kill me."

<sup>11-12</sup> Then he was told, "Go, stand on the mountain at attention before GOD. GOD will pass by."

A hurricane wind ripped through the mountains and shattered the rocks before GoD, but GoD wasn't to be found in the wind; after the wind an earthquake, but GoD wasn't in the earthquake; and after the earthquake fire, but GoD wasn't in the fire; and after the fire a gentle and quiet whisper. <sup>13</sup> When Elijah heard the quiet voice, he muffled his face with his great cloak, went to the mouth of the cave, and stood there. A quiet voice asked, "So Elijah, now tell me, what are you doing here?"
