**Epistle Reading:** Acts 2:1-13

When the day of Pentecost came, the disciples were all together in one place. Suddenly a noise came from heaven. It sounded like a strong wind blowing. This noise filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw something that looked like flames of fire. The flames were separated and stood over each person there. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they began to speak different languages. The Holy Spirit was giving them the power to speak these languages.

There were some religious people staying in Jerusalem who were from every country in the world. When they heard this noise, a crowd came together. They were all surprised, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were completely amazed at this. They said, "Look! Aren't all these people that we hear speaking from Galilee? But each of us hears them in their own language. How is this possible? We are from different places: Parthia, Media, Elam, Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, Asia, Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, the areas of Libya near Cyrene,

Rome, Crete and Arabia. But we hear these people telling in our own languages about the great things God has done!" They were all amazed and confused. They asked each other, "What does this mean?" But others were making fun of them, saying, "They have had too much wine."

Sermon: The Holy Spirit Works in Mysterious Ways

Communion Introduction: We celebrate God's Holy Spirit, who hovered over creation and brought order out of formlessness. We celebrate the Spirit, who filled Jesus with power and wisdom and through him, made life available to all. We celebrate the Spirit, who has been poured out on all people, and leads us into the reign of God. And so, as we gather at this table, we recognize the Spirit's presence among us, and we open our hearts to the Spirit's influence.

**Prayer:** God, we come knowing that we depend on you for life and truth and love. We come knowing that you welcome us with open and accepting arms. We come ready to meet with you, and be changed by the encounter. Amen. (*Deacons distribute bread* – gluten-free)

Our Lord Jesus, on the eve of his crucifixion, gathered his friends for a meal. During supper, he took a loaf of bread, and gave thanks for it. Then he broke it and passed it among them with these words: This is my body which is broken for you. Take, eat and remember me.

(Take together. Deacons distribute juice)

After the meal, Jesus took a cup of wine and gave thanks for it. Then he passed it among them with these words: This is my life which is given for you. Take, drink and remember me. (*Take together*)

Let us pray together: Gracious God, as we share this bread and cup, let it be a sharing in Christ's body, life and presence; and may we embody your life, love, and Spirit in our homes and community. Amen.
