TODAY'S SCRIPTURES: Leviticus 25:1-12

At Mount Sinai, Our God instructed Moses to tell the Israelites these things:

When you enter the land I am giving you, the land itself must observe a Sabbath for Your God. For six years you may sow your fields and prune your vineyards and gather their crops. But in the seventh year the land is to have a Sabbath of rest, a Sabbath for Your God. Do not harvest what grows of itself, or store the grapes of your untended vines. It will be a year of complete rest for the land. On the other hand, what the land produces on its own will be food for you, for your female and male bonded workers, for your hired hands, for the strangers living among you, for your livestock and for the wild animals in your land. You may eat whatever the land yields.

Count off seven "weeks" of years – seven times seven years – so that the seven Sabbaths of years come to a period of forty-nine years. Then, on the tenth day of the seventh month – the Day of Atonement – sound the trumpet throughout all your land. Consecrate the fiftieth year and proclaim freedom in the land for all its inhabitants. It is your year of Jubilee: each of you is to return to your ancestral land, to your own family. The fiftieth year is the Jubilee for you; do not sow and do not reap what grows of itself or harvest the untended vines. For it is a Jubilee and it is to be holy for you. Eat only what comes directly from the fields.

Luke 4:14-19

Jesus returned in the power of the Spirit to Galilee, and his reputation spread throughout the region. He was teaching in the Galilean synagogues, and all were loud in their praise.

Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. Entering the synagogue on the Sabbath, as was his habit, Jesus stood up to do the reading. When the book of the prophet Isaiah was handed him, he unrolled the scroll and found the passage were it was written:

"The Spirit of Our God is upon me: because the Most High has anointed me to bring Good News to those who are poor.

God has sent me to proclaim liberty to those held captive, recovery of sight to those who are blind, and release to those in prison - to proclaim the year of Our God's favor."
