A behind the scenes look at World Sports.....

In two days, the Football World Cup will kick off in Qatar with billions of people worldwide glued to screens in hypes of nationalism and camaraderie. As you might have already read, this World Cup is not without controversy; most significantly, the death of 6500 migrant workers who died while building the infrastructure needed for this tiny nation to host the tournament. Most workers who make it to Qatar from South Asia pay an agent a recruitment fee averaging around 1500 USD. For those who die, the burden of paying the loan back falls on surviving family members. In most cases, another adult family member or a teenage son awaits to migrate. This cycle traps them in a debt spiral.

On arrival, the worker gets trapped in the Kafala labour system, where the employer seizes the passports, and changing jobs is prohibited. Qatar passed a law to abolish the system, but labour and human rights organizations claim its implementation is lacking.

Qatar might have a labour system that violates human rights, but large global corporations also use these laws in their favour to recruit migrant workers and profit from their sweat and deaths. The World Cup is a money-making machine deeply entrenched in a predatory capitalistic

system. Qatar will spend 220 billion dollars to host these games, and FIFA, the global football association, will most likely make over 4 billion dollars in net profit.

How do we speak of labour rights when we have a system designed to exploit people? How do we talk about migration when borders are barriers for people and not capital? How do we critique other systems of oppression while recognizing the benefits some of our countries derive from centuries of colonization and exploitation? How do we break from the chains of the oligarchy?

Will you be one of the 3.5 billion people watching the World Cup?
