Leviticus 19:1-2, 9-18 1 Yhwh told Moses to tell the entire Israelite community these things: be holy, for I, Yhwh, am holy. 9 When you reap the harvest from your fields, do not cut the grain to the very edges of the field, or gather in all the gleanings. 10 Nor are you to completely strip your vines or pick up the fallen fruit. Leave the extra grain and fruit for poor people and foreigners to gather for themselves. I am Yhwh. 11 Do not steal. Do not lie. Do not cheat your neighbor. 12 Do not swear by my name with the intent to deceive, for if you do, you profane my name. I am Yhwh. 13 Do not oppress your neighbors or rob them. If you are angry with your neighbor, speak frankly about it, to avoid storing up ill feelings. 18 Never seek revenge or hold a grudge toward your relatives. You must love your neighbor as you love yourself. I am Yhwh.

Matthew 5:38-48 38 "You've heard the commandment, 'an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' 39 But I tell you, offer no resistance whatsoever when you're confronted with violence. When someone strikes you on the right cheek, turn and offer the other. 40 If anyone wants to sue you for your shirt, hand over your coat as well. 41 Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go two miles. 42 Give to those who beg from you. And don't turn your back on those who want to borrow from you. 43 "You have heard it said, 'Love your neighbor-but hate your enemy.' 44 But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for your persecutors. 45 This will prove that you are children of God.
