For those on-line, please hold your communion bread and for those in sanctuary, as carefully as you can, please peel off the communion wafer and you can put the juice part in the holders in the back of the pews.

Let us pray:

Almighty God, you have poured into us the new light of your incarnate Word. Send your Holy Spirit to us so that this light, ***From the Re-opening and Executive committees**: As we are all aware, the number of COVID cases in Saskatchewan is on the rise. For that reason, we are reminding people of some of the procedures we are using to maintain as safe a church as possible.

1. Properly fitted and worn masks are mandatory. The science on wearing these is very clear. It helps.

2. Please sit ON the green tape. The tape was placed on the benches to insure we maintain at least 2 metres from each other. Even sitting as close to the isle as possible for tape on the sides and as close to the middle as possible for the tape in the middle of the benches will help keep the proper physical distancing.

3. Please bring your coat with you into the sanctuary and not use the coat racks. This will help relieve the congestion in the lobby.

We have added some additional guidelines:

We have new restrictions in place that adhere to the new regulations that the Saskatchewan Government has set up for churches. As a result, we are asking you to do the following:

1. If you can use live stream to connect with the worship service, we would ask you to stay home and connect virtually through Facebook. The church service is still open for in person worship for those who want or need to attend in person for technological or spiritual reasons.

2. Due to the 30 person limit (for us it would be 20 people plus the worship team), **people attending in person are required to register with Loretta by Friday NOON so we know who can be accommodated that week. You can email the church office at oslermcoffice@sasktel.net or text Loretta at 306-281-2237.**

3. Visiting is an important part of church and it is getting colder outside, but we cannot clog up the lobby or the front entrance pad. So we are saying "**Thanks for caring by not lingering in the lobby or outside the door**". The multi-purpose room is available after church. **Please move into the multi-purpose room to have your physically distanced visits.** If we continue to clog up the lobby, we will be required to directly exit the building after church in order to maintain proper social distancing. We would much rather you have the opportunity to visit in the warmth of the church in the multipurpose room. *enkindled in our hearts, may shine forth in our lives.* Let us eat together in silence. In the same way, let us hold our cups at home and carefully hold them while we pray.

Give us grace to cast away the works of darkness and to put on the armour of light now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to us in great humility; and also on the last day where the Lamb will be our light forever. We pray through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen. Let us drink.
