From Paul, Silas and Timothy, To the people of the church in Thessalonica, who belong to Abba God and our Savior Jesus Christ: May grace and peace be yours. 2 We always thank God for all of you and remember you in our prayers. 3 We call to mind before our God and Creator how you are proving your faith by your actions, laboring in love, and showing constancy of hope in our Savior Jesus Christ.

- 9 They themselves report to us what kind of reception we had among you, how you turned from idols to God, to be faithful witnesses of the living and true God, 10 and to await the appearance from heaven of Jesus, the Only Begotten, whom God raised from the dead and who will deliver us from the wrath to come.

Update on Bolivia Church Relations – The Bolivia Church Relations Group of Charleswood Mennonite Church has continued to maintain contact with our brothers and sisters in Santa Cruz during these trying times of the covid-19 pandemic. Covid-19 has not skipped Bolivia. The Day Care Center which we support financially was closed in late March and is now anticipated to re-open in January. In the meantime the Evangelical Mennonite Church in Bolivia is offering courses to Day Care workers and parents of Day Care children on how to start a business to address the desperate need of added income. They are also looking for funds to assist those who successfully complete such a course to actually start an income generating business.

As was the case last year, invitations have been sent out to individuals who have served in Bolivia and are familiar with the Bolivia Church to consider adding to the \$1,000 budgeted by our congregation in support of the Day Care Center. Furthermore, MC Canada International Witness has included the Bolivia Church in its listing of International Witness programs it is supporting. This could result in individuals from across Canada contributing to the critical need in Bolivia.
