




Scripture Reading: Matthew 21:33-46 (Inclusive Bible)

"Listen to another parable. There was a property owner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, installed a winepress and erected a tower. Then the owner leased it out to tenant farmers and went on a journey. 34 "When vintage time arrived, the owner sent aides to the tenants to divide the shares of the grapes. 35 The tenants responded by seizing the aides. They beat one, killed another and stoned a third. 36 A second time the owner sent even more aides than before, but they treated them the same way. 37 Finally, the owner sent the family heir to them, thinking, 'They will respect my heir.' 38 "When the vine growers saw the heir, they said to one another, 'Here's the one who stands in the way of our having everything. With a single act of murder we could seize the inheritance.' 39 With that, they grabbed and killed the heir outside the vineyard.

- 40 What do you suppose the owner of the vineyard will do to those tenants?" 41 They replied, "The owner will bring that wicked crowd to a horrible death and lease the vineyard out to others, who will see to it that there are grapes for the proprietor at vintage time." 42 Jesus said to them, "Did you ever read in the scriptures, 'The stone which the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone; it was our God's doing and we find it marvelous to behold? 43 "That's why I tell you that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to people who will bear its fruit. 44 "Those who fall on this stone will be dashed to pieces, and those on whom it falls will be smashed."
- 45 When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard these parables, they realized that Jesus was speaking about them. 46 Although they sought to arrest him, they feared the crowds, who regarded Jesus as a prophet.



Scripture Reading: Philippians 3:4b-14 (Inclusive Bible)

If they think they have the right to put their trust in external evidence, I have even more right! 5 I was circumcised on the eighth day, being of the stock of Israel and the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrew origins; in legal observance I was a Pharisee, 6 and so zealous that I persecuted the church. I was above reproach when it came to justice based on the Law. 7 But those things I used to consider gain, I now count as loss for the sake of Christ. 8 What is more, I consider everything a loss in light of the surpassing knowledge of my Savior Jesus Christ, for whose sake I have forfeited everything. I count everything else as garbage, so that

Christ may be my wealth— 9 indeed, that I may be found in Christ, not having any justice of my own based on observance of the Law. The justice I possess is that which comes through faith in Christ. It has its origin in God and is based on faith.

- 10 All I want is to know Christ, and the power of the resurrection, and how to share in Christ's sufferings by being formed into the pattern of Jesus' death—11 perhaps even to arrive at the resurrection from the dead.
- 12 It's not that I have reached it yet, or have already finished my course; but I'm running the race in order to grab hold of the prize if possible, since Christ Jesus has grabbed hold of me. 13 Sisters and brothers, I don't think of myself as having reached the finish line. I give no thought to what lies behind, but I push on to what is ahead. 14 My entire attention is on the finish line as I run toward the prize—the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.


