





Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 35:4-7a (Inclusive Version)

Say to all those faint of heart: "Take courage! Do not be afraid! Look Yahweh is coming, vindication is coming, the recompense of God is coming to save you!" Then the ears of the blind will be opened, the ears of the deaf will be unsealed. Then those who cannot walk will leap like deer and the tongues of those who cannot speak will sing for joy. Waters will break forth in the wilderness, and there will be streams in the desert. The scorched earth will become a lake; the parched land, springs of water.

Gospel Reading: Mark 7:24-37 (First Nations Version)

From the village of Chief Garden (Gennesaret), Creator Sets Free (Jesus) journeyed into the territory of Rock Land (Tyre) and Hunting Grounds (Sidon). He wanted to keep away from the crowds, so he found a house to stay out of sight, but was unable to stay hidden. A woman came to him who had a daughter with an unclean spirit in her. As soon as she heard about Creator Sets Free (Jesus), she came to him and fell down at his feet. She was an Outsider from the territory along the coastline of the Great Middle Sea (Mediterranean). She begged Creator Sets Free (Jesus) to force the evil spirit out of her daughter. "The children should be fed first," he said. "It's not right to take the children's portion and throw it to the dogs." "But Wisdomkeeper," she answered back, "even the dogs under the table can eat the children's crumbs." "Because your words are well chosen," he replied, "you may return home. You will find that the evil spirit has left your daughter." The woman went home and found her daughter resting on her sleeping mat - the evil spirit had left her.

From the territory of Rock Land (Tyre) Creator Sets Free (Jesus) went through Hunting Grounds (Sidon) to the Lake of Circle of Nations (Sea of Galilee) in the territory of the Ten Villages (Decapolis). The people who lived there brought a man who could not hear or speak right. They begged Creator Sets Free (Jesus) to lay his hands on him. So he took the man away from the crowd. When he was alone with him, he put his fingers into the man's ears and then spit and touched the man's tongue. He then looked up into the world above, let out a deep breath and said in his native language, "ephphatha!" which means, "be opened." Right then the man's ears were opened and his tongue was released. He could now hear and speak clearly! Creator Sets Free (Jesus) then instructed the people to tell no one. But the more he told them not to, the more they told the story to others. The people were amazed beyond belief and full of wonder. "He does all things well! they told everyone. "He even heals the ones who cannot hear or speak!"







Introduction

Elaine Enns has worked in the field of restorative justice since 1989, first focusing on victim-offender dialogue work in the Criminal Justice System, and more recently looking at how restorative justice applies to historical violations, including issues of intergenerational trauma and healing. She holds a Doctor of Ministry, and leads workshops throughout North America on restorative solidarity. She most recently coauthored (with her partner activist theologian Ched Myers) Healing Haunted Histories: Decolonizing Settler Landlines, Bloodlines, Songlines (Wipf & Stock, 2020); in 2009 the two-volume Ambassadors of Reconciliation: A New Testament Theology and Diverse

Christian Practices of Restorative Justice and Peacemaking. (Orbis Books, 2009); and has published over a dozen articles. An ecumenical Mennonite, Elaine was born and raised in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan, and lives in southern California where she co-directs Bartimaeus Cooperative Ministries (www.bcm-net.org) on traditional Chumash land. Ched Myers is an activist theologian and New Testament expositor working with peace and justice issues. He is a popular educator, animating scripture and literacy in historic and current social change movements. Myers has published over a hundred articles and eight books, including Binding the Strong Man: A Political Reading of Mark's Story of Jesus (Orbis, 1988). He and his partner Elaine Enns are ecumenical Mennonites who codirect Bartimaeus Cooperative Ministries (www.bcm-net.org), based in the Ventura River Watershed of southern California in traditional Chumash territory.
