Welcome/Announcements

Call to Worship from Isaiah 2:2-5

One: In the days to come the mountain of God's house shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be raised above the hill; all the nations shall stream to it. Many people shall come and say:

Many: "Come, let us go up to the mountain of the LORD, to the house of the God of Jacob; that God may teach us God's ways and that we may walk in God's paths."

One: "For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations, and shall arbitrate for many peoples; they shall beat their swords into ploughshares, and their spears into pruning-hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, neither shall they learn war any more.

Many: "O house of Jacob, people of OMC, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!"

One: How shall we prepare this house for the birth of Jesus?

The Christmas Tree: *light the tree during the following reading:*

God, the Holy One of Israel, is a God of comfort and compassion. With the Christmas tree we remember God's everlasting promises to the poor and needy.

Isaiah spoke of God's making of the wilderness a place of blessing where water and plants, even pine trees,

Would manifest God's loving action to save and provide.

Isaiah 41:17-20

When the poor and needy seek water, and there is none, and their tongue is parched with thirst,

I the LORD will answer them, I the God of Israel will not forsake them. I will open rivers on the bare heights, and fountains in the midst of the valleys;

I will make the wilderness a pool of water, I will put in the wilderness the cedar, the acacia, the myrtle, and the olive; I will set in the desert the cypress, the plain and the pine together, so that all may see and know, all may consider and understand, that the hand of the LORD has done this, the Holy One of Israel has created it.

Josh: During Advent, we celebrate with all creation the birth of Immanuel, God with Us.

All: A voice cries, "Shout for joy, all the earth; break forth, O mountains, into singing!

For God brings comfort to the people, and will have compassion on all creation."

Josh: With rocks and rivers and trees, we join our voices and lives in response, echoing praise. And the Spirit of God lifts our singing and sighing, groans and *glorias*, gifting us one by one with faith, wisdom, creativity, and compassion.

Luke: Sprit of imagination and expectation: In this holy season, give us hope in our hearts. Prepare us to hear the music of creation and see the beauty of your presence among us.¹

All: The Spirit of Truth and Peace is with us today!

Josh: This morning we celebrate the unique intersecting of Luke's journey with that of this congregation.
