### Gospel Reading: John 15:1-8 (First Nations Version)

I am the True Vine. Creator is the Vine Keeper who cuts off the branches in me that have no fruit and who carefully trims back the branches with fruit, so they will grow more fruit. My teachings have purified you, but you must stay joined to me in the same way a branch is joined to the vine. A branch cannot grow fruit unless it is joined to the vine.
