After this, Jesus went across the Sea of Galilee (some call it Tiberias). A huge crowd followed him, attracted by the miracles they had seen him do among the sick. When he got to the other side, he climbed a hill and sat down, surrounded by his disciples. It was nearly time for the Feast of Passover, kept annually by the Jews. When Jesus looked out and saw that a

large crowd had arrived, he said to Philip, "Where can we buy bread to feed these people?" He said this to stretch Philip's faith. He already knew what he was going to do.

Philip answered, "Two hundred silver pieces wouldn't be enough to buy bread for each person to get a piece." One of the disciples—it was Andrew, brother to Simon Peter—said, "There's a little boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But that's a drop in the bucket for a crowd like this." Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." There was a nice carpet of green grass in this place. They sat down, about five thousand of them. Then Jesus took the bread and, having given thanks, gave it to those who were seated. He did the same with the fish. All ate as much as they wanted. When the people had eaten their fill, he said to his disciples, "Gather the leftovers so nothing is wasted." They went to work and filled twelve large baskets with leftovers from the five barley loaves. The people realized that God was at work among them in what Jesus had just done. They said, "This is the Prophet for sure, God's Prophet right here in Galilee!" Jesus saw that in their enthusiasm, they were about to grab him and make him king, so he slipped off and went back up the mountain to be by himself.

MCC Connects: Grow Hope Saskatchewan Field Day! How do the crops we grow in Saskatchewan support emergency food assistance in regions of conflict, drought, and disaster? Join us on Sunday, August 11th at the annual Cherry Sunday Festival in Bruno to learn more and to tour one of the Grow Hope fields.

**Thanksgiving:** MCC's shipment of food from Jordan has entered Gaza over the past few weeks, but much more is needed. MCC has been working with partners on the ground in Gaza to provide essential emergency relief to children and families. More than 550 families have already received food kits that include rice, flour, oil and canned beans and vegetables.

## **MC Updates:**

This morning we received a call to prayer from Jon Olfert, Director at Camp Valaqua in MC Alberta You may have seen the news that there is a fire burning about 20 km west of Water Valley. Jon reports that no communities, nor the camp, are threatened at this time. Fire fighters and

equipment including aircraft are attending to the fire scene, and the most recent word is that the fire has been re-categorized to "being held." Although Valaqua is not in immediate danger, Jon has been updating parents and has an evacuation plan in place should the need arise. Please pray

For those actively fighting this fire, as well as many other fires across Western Canada. Pray for safety, clear minds, good decision-making, and physical strength.

For Jon, Manager Jeff, and the Camp Valaqua summer staff. Pray in thanksgiving for the emergency plans already in place should the need arise. Pray for calm hearts and minds as they navigate the challenges of this day.

Pray for the campers who are at camp right now, that they may continue to enjoy the ministry of the camp under the care of the capable camp staff. Pray for their parents and grandparents who may be worried should the situation change. May they be assured in the knowledge that professional and caring staff are monitoring the situation closely and are prepared should an evacuation be necessary.
