**Epistle Reading:** Romans 8:26-39 (*Updated NRSV*)

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with groanings too deep for words. And God, who searches hearts, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to God's purpose. For those whom the Holy One foreknew were also predestined to be conformed to the image of Christ, in order that Christ might be the firstborn within a large family. And those whom God predestined, were also called, and those who were called were also justified, and those who were justified were also glorified.

What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? The Holy One who did not withhold their own Son but gave him up for all of us. How will The Holy One not also give us everything? Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? It is Christ who died, or rather, who was raised, who is also at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or peril or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are

accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than victorious through the One who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

#### **Sermon Reflection:**

The women in today's story are both given voice and agency in a patriarchal society. What are the scripture writers trying to tell us by this generational repetition?

- 2. Genesis is the story of pre-organized religion where individuals call on God and make altars and sacred places wherever they encounter God. There also appears to be some mixing of religions with "The Living One Who Sees and Hears" and household idols (probably fertility gods). At this point, there doesn't seem to be judgement about that but after the Exodus, God will want sole loyalty, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me."
- 3. Struggling with God and others marks the whole biblical story from beginning to end. What does struggle with God do for us? How does our struggles with others show us God's face? How does this reality of struggle challenge the notion that "if we just believe in God, everything will be perfect?"
