As Patrick and I sleeplessly watched our bedroom ceiling fan rotate these past summer nights without air conditioning, it was a literal wake-up call for us on climate change. I try to integrate thanksgiving for creation and God our Creator in our services. Love of creation inspires my

action. April 22 Earth Day, OMC had a Zoom gathering with OMC Saints of Solar: Lucy and Russ Friesen, John Gascho and Melanie and Kevin Boldt and their investment in solar panels for business and home. It inspired Patrick and I to take up the City of Saskatoon's Green Initiative for solar panels of our own this fall.

Creation is an important part of our personal and collective faith. Our August 1st Outdoor Service in the Cathedral of the Trees on Wilf and Ruth's yard inspired awe and thankfulness. Nature Church hosted at Shekinah Retreat Center the first Sunday of every month has been a place for Valley Mennonites who love nature to connect and inspire each other in climate change action. Canadian Mennonite University Professor Dan Thiessen-Epp teaches a portable class on a Christian Response to Climate Change that we as a congregation hope to participate in this fall.

Nora's Notes:

When I opened my Bible early this week, it broke. That is, the binding on the book was no longer attached, so the cover fell off. It fell away gently like it had been broken for a while and this was just the first time I really noticed. It is probably a case of cheaply produced books but I took it as a poetic symbol of my current state, because that is my nature.

As case numbers increase again and I start to reinstate some of my pre-vaccine cautions around public exposure and masking up, I feel disheartened. My practices of spiritual self-care that have sustained me through the past 18 months are starting to feel stale and worn through as I try to imagine what choices await us for protecting our neighbours and communities heading into fall. This may not come as a surprise, but I find a lot of spiritual nourishment in books and Biblical study, and theological reflection. I have been clinging to the practices that sustain my soul with white knuckled insistence as various waves of emotions from the past year wash over me. What I've come to realise is that I need to set down my tried and true spiritual care practices (like reading my Bible with clenched fists – as it is now clearly pleading for a break). I wonder if others may also be looking for renewal in this area, so I thought I'd write down my list in hopes that it can give you permission to wander into your own new discoveries of God's nurturing presence.

- sing a hymn aloud, by myself each week, intentionally letting this take up space as a form of prayer

- take a Sabbath, an actual 24hr Sabbath where I don't work or do school. (This one feels scary to write down.)
- going for a walk before I go to bed, even if it's a really, really short walk, even if it's just sitting on the porch.

MDS CANADA

Hello Church,

Greetings from MDS Canada! Thanks so much for being willing to share news and information about MDS with your church. Due to the pandemic, our work has been limited. But that doesn't mean we haven't been active in smaller ways! Thanks to willing volunteers, operating safely through COVID-19 protocols, we have been able to be active this year.

SERVE

Due to the pandemic, there are no major MDS projects in Canada at this time. (Just a few smaller local ones.) Also due to the pandemic, the U.S./Canada border is closed so Canadians can't go south to places where MDS is able to operate. Below find some updates on MDS activity in Canada; we hope one day soon we can send you a list of needs for volunteers!

B.C. wildfires. There are over 270 wildfires burning in the province, and thousands have either been evacuated from their homes or on alert to leave. MDS in B.C. is monitoring the situation to see if there is a role for MDS to play down the road when reconstruction efforts begin.

Winnipeg, Man. Progress has been slow on assisting a homeowner in Winnipeg, in partnership with Home Street Mennonite Church. The complex nature of the work that has needed to be corrected, along with clearing up old, open permits, has extended the life of this project. Dave and Anna Wiebe have been giving patient leadership to this project.

Westbank Bible Camp. In July, volunteers with MDS Saskatchewan renovated and upgraded the office building at Westbank Bible Camp, a Mennonite Brethren camp located north of Swift Current. (*This is the project Edna Zacharias volunteered at*)
