Our Statement of Purpose

The purpose of Osler Mennonite Church is to be a supportive community in which people can meet God through worship and fellowship. We seek to teach an Anabaptist understanding of scripture, led by the Spirit to imitate Christ in word and deed. We strive to nurture faith and discipleship, committing ourselves individually and corporately to respond to the needs of others. **Humor Under Duress**: Under Soviet leader Josef Stalin, telling a joke about the Soviet regime was considered tantamount to treason and could lead to imprisonment or death. Despite the risks, people shared jokes about the tyrant Stalin and the repressive regime as a means of coping with the dire circumstances of their lives. The later Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev recalled: "the jokes always saved us." (Aeon, December 11)

CAPSULE SERMONS

Timing the Sermon: The Pew Research Centre analyzed nearly 50,000 sermons from about 6,500 congregations and determined the the median length of all sermons was 37 minutes. Catholic sermons were the shortest, with the median being 14 minutes. Sermons in mainline Protestant congregations came in at 25 minutes. Sermons in historically black Protestant churches were the longest - the median length was 54 minutes. Preachers preach for as long as they hold people's attention, noted one homiletics professor. (Associated Press, December 16). (Hmmm......how long are Pastor Patty and Pastor Nora's sermons?)
