

I can't believe we're in June already but the mad dash to graduation and garden planting tells me it is so. It is a blessing we didn't even have to work for, but we must be vigilant in our welcome and getting to know new people and gently integrating them and offering meaningful worship and Christian education.

In the midst of all this new life at church, I'm finding new courage in leadership. Dr. Brene Brown in Dare to Lead has given me some tools for difficult conversations - rumble starters she calls them - which engage people and seek curiosity and connection instead of correction, which is a huge shift in my avoiding fears over conflict in marriage, family and church. Some of these rumble starters are:

- 1. The story I make up about this situation is...
- 2. I'm curious about that choice...
- 3. Tell me more...

4. That's not been my experience with that person. My experience with that person has been...

- 5. I'm wondering...
- 6. Help me understand what just happened...
- 7. Walk me through what just happened...
- 8. We're both dug in. Tell me about your passion about this...
- 9. Tell me why this doesn't work for you...
- 10. I'm working from these assumptions. How about you?
- 11. What problem are we trying to solve here?

May the Pentecostal power of the Holy Spirit help guide us calmly with difficult conversations at home and church.

*<u>Micah Mission volunteer opportunities</u>:

Circles of Support and Accountability (CoSA) offers volunteers an opportunity to support a person who has been released into the community, who has the desire to not reoffend. These persons have offended sexually and the goal of CoSA is ensuring there are no more victims. Volunteers meet weekly with the "Core Member" for about an hour to discuss how life is going as well as to offer a social interaction that such offenders are often missing in their lives. Micah Mission offers orientation and training for this but your application can be processed much more quickly and you can be volunteering in a short time.

"<u>A Fish Story</u>" by Justina Peters, Bethany Manor Chronicle September 1, 2015

My grandparents lived on the picturesque banks of the fast-flowing Irtysch River in Siberia. When the river ice broke up in spring there was often flooding in surrounding areas. As a young lad their son Johann (my father), enjoyed exploring along the river bank. One day he was surprised to find a pool of water full of fish which were stranded due to the receding waters of the river.

Wow! These were butter fish! His mouth watered at the thought of having his dear step-mother pan-fry them for their supper. The problem was he had come to the river empty-handed with absolutely nothing in which to carry them home. On second thought, he could improvise. He quickly undressed, tossing aside his one-piece long underwear, then just as quickly he redressed in his shirt, pants and jacket. Picking up his underwear he tied knots in sleeves and leggings. He stuffed as many of these slippery fish into his improvised pouch as it would hold. He then slung his make-shift bag over his shoulder to carry them home, knowing with delight, that his hankering for fresh fish would be satisfied.

"This past year, I found a huge fish washed up on the beach near my home. I'd never seen anything like it. I discovered it was a lake sturgeon, which can live 150 years and grows to more than ten feet long. Lake sturgeon used to be one of the most prolific species in Lake Ontario but is now endangered. Ever since then, I've wondered, is seeking the welfare of lake sturgeon wrapped up with my welfare? Was that great fish a prophet speaking in the only way it could? " —Carol Penner
