#### **Pastor Patty's Ponderings:**

March 1 begins seven weeks of Lent until Easter and while we are not high-church strict on observances of fasts, it is a seasonal opportunity to "reorient, reassess and rearrange our lives to more fully respond to God's invitation. The call to more fully respond is at once profoundly personal and uncompromisingly communal. It is a season whose purpose is to knit us closer to our God." (Wendy Wright, Rising p. 26)

It is wonderful to sit in on Kids' Bible on Monday nights and hear them talking through who Jesus is in the Gospel of Matthew. It is equally powerful to sit in on the Wednesdays at 1:00 Bible study with older people also working through the Gospel of Matthew. This is faith formation. At Canadian Mennonite University Pastors' Week on Faith Formation, we heard from students doing faith sharing using 1-3 objects. Using objects helped them explore their growing relationship with God as they learned to articulate that relationship with others. I thought the exercise was fitting for all ages so we are going to try it in our Christianity and Culture class through the season of Lent. It is an exercise that could be tried with children, youth, elders and intergenerational groups as we continue to practice creative and metaphorical ways of sharing who God is to us and how we see God's presence in our lives. We are never finished having our faith formed.

#### **Pastor Patty's Picks**

Christ in Crisis by Jim Wallis is another helpful reorientation to our understanding of Christ and the role of Christianity in an increasingly polarized society.

When Life Gives You Pears by Jeannie Gaffigan is a powerful brain tumour memoir of strength, humour, resiliency and trust.

Nora's Notes: I got the most beautiful request from one of our youth this past month, "Can we have more youth events." Currently we are in the rhythm of holding two youth events a month, with additional group mentorship events twice a year. At my current work distribution this is what I am able to offer. However, how could someone say no to such an excellent request! The Education committee and Youth Ministry Team have come up with a proposed solution: What if once a month, we had different people in the congregation 'host' the youth for a night. They could have the youth over to their house, or use the church whatever they prefer. The agenda would be completely up to the hosts, movie night, gym games, board games, farm fun, etc. It would be a more casual event, giving the youth another chance to get together.

The hope is that I would not be attending these events, but I could help coordinate dates with the youth calendar and send out all the information. This would only be the Osler Youth Group, so it would be a smaller crew (averaging at about 5-6 in attendance). We have our first hosts signed up for April (big thanks to Diane & Ben!). If this is something that interests you please let me know! The idea is that they can be very flexible, so if you are unsure let me know that to, and we can talk it through.
