We have built several church buildings, sponsored several refugee families and weathered several family storms in 90 years - all while trying to seek God's guidance and be faithful in our lives and share our faith with the next generations. ## Terri Lynn's Takes:

**Every Brilliant Thing - A play-ful encounter with mental health.** Over the last couple of years, our community has seen the very real need to de-stigmatize conversation about mental health, and make sure that the church is a safe place to have these (sometimes difficult) conversations around how we talk about our mental health, especially in tough times. We've had sermons and workshops, and articles in the Canadian Mennonite. We've thought about it, tried to talk about it, prayed about it. Here is an opportunity to encounter someone's perspective on mental health through theatre, which can often take us places that we can not go otherwise...maybe even giving us an opportunity to laugh about it.

Burnt Thicket Theatre, in similar ways to Theatre of the Beat and Ted & Co. produce plays that allow artists and audiences to live more engaged lives for the common good of our world. The play *Every Brilliant Thing* addresses depression and suicide with perceptive wisdom and an astonishingly funny narrative that speaks with realism and hope. The story leaves a lasting encouragement to cultivate gratitude as our posture for life. If you frequent the Fringe festival, this might be a play for you.

\*Saskatoon Friendship Inn graciously accepts food donations on a daily basis from 7:00 am – 2:30 pm. Donations can be dropped off at the southwest door in the parking lot. *Please provide the Friendship Inn with a receipt for food if you wish to receive a charitable tax receipt for your donation.* 

- We accept any fresh home-grown fruits and vegetables, but cannot be receipted. (For example: fresh from the garden potatoes, carrots, peas, beans etc.)
- We accept any unopened groceries from your home that you no longer use. (For example macaroni, rice, sugar, coffee etc.), but cannot be receipted.
- The Saskatoon Friendship Inn relies on the generous support of our community. You can help out by making a donation of food, hygiene items or funds. Some of the items we are looking for are listed below.

Nutrition: Oatmeal; sugar; coffee; jam; peanut butter

**<u>Hygiene:</u>** Toothbrush & Toothpaste; shampoo & conditioner; deodorant; disposable razors; pads & tampons.

**Babies & Children:** Formula, bottles; disposable diapers (larger sizes); baby food/snacks.

The Saskatoon Friendship Inn employs a full time Family Worker, sponsored by the Ministry of Social Services. This office services hundreds of individuals and families each year as a resource to assist with emergency issues such as family violence, child protection, and referrals. Often families will come to the Friendship Inn in need of emergency supplies that are handed out when available.

During the winter months we are also collecting warm clothing such as winter coats, mitts, toques and scarves. Men's jackets and mitts or gloves are the most needed items.
