We are entering our Fall Kick-Off season in September and our sixth month into the pandemic. Worship Changes in History: The coronavirus pandemic is prodding religious communities to think creatively about how to minister to the faithful in spite of social distancing. Some communities are even offering baptism via Zoom. Samuel L. Boyd, a biblical scholar and historian, says there's plenty of precedent for this kind of ritual adaptation. The destruction of the Jewish temples in Jerusalem, especially the destruction of the second one in AD 70, led to profound and permanent changes in the way the Jewish community worshiped, from being a temple-based religion to being a text-based one. Without the temple, prayer itself came to be viewed as sacrifice. (Christian Century, Apr.22/20)


When the world cries, when the church clings, when I'm feeling stressed, I simply remember my pastoral things and know that God's in the mess.
