Different models of how the church (the body of Christ) relates to culture.

By H. Richard Niebuhr

Christ Against Culture

The church is separate from culture because secular culture is to be avoided.

Christ of Culture

The church and dominant culture appear to coexist nicely, such as the label "A Christian nation." Actions and language are blended.

Christ above Culture

The church strives to rule over culture, such as the Catholic church during the Middle Ages.

Christ and Culture Paradox

This is a dualistic model: church and culture tolerate each other. This is often referred to as the "Two Kingdoms."

Christ the Transformer of Culture

The church is active "in" culture nurturing peace, justice and grace. This model is not static, and it is the most challenging model.

Remember:

The church is the body of Christ in the world today. The church is dynamic and consists of the followers of Christ. We are in process; we are following, and we are vibrant and ever-changing. As Stuart Murray puts it in his book, "The Naked Anabaptist", Our "...core convictions are aspirations rather than achievements." We strive to practice what we preach (Jesus' way and message), but we haven't yet arrived at the perfection.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

Isaiah 61:1 - 2 (NRSV) ¹ The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; ² to proclaim the year of the LORD'S favor, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn;

Luke 6:6 - 11 (NRSV) ⁶On another sabbath he entered the synagogue and taught, and there was a man there whose right hand was withered. ⁷The scribes and the Pharisees watched him to see whether he would cure on the sabbath, so that they might find an accusation against him. ⁸Even though he knew what they were thinking, he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come and stand here." He got up and stood there. ⁹Then Jesus said to them, "I ask you, is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to destroy it?" ¹⁰After looking around at all of them, he said to him, "Stretch out your hand." He did so, and his hand was restored. ¹¹But they were filled with fury and discussed with one another what they might do to Jesus.
