Please join us in thanking God for the safety of the Houmphans and Living Water Church, and pray for the spiritual, physical, mental and emotional well-being of the citizens of Thailand as they cope with this disaster. May the light and love of God shine in the midst of despair.

#### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:**

**Genesis 12:1 - 9 (NRSV)** <sup>1</sup>Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. <sup>2</sup>I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. <sup>3</sup>I will bless those who bless you, and the one who curses you I will curse; and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." <sup>4</sup>So Abram went, as the LORD had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he departed from Haran. <sup>5</sup>Abram took his wife Sarai and his brother's son Lot, and all the possessions that they had gathered, and the persons whom they had acquired in Haran; and they set forth to go to the land of Canaan. When they had come to the land of Canaan, <sup>6</sup>Abram passed through the land to the place at Shechem, to the oak of Moreh.
