
### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:**

**Psalm 103:1 - 3 (NRSV)** <sup>1</sup> Bless the LORD, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless God's holy name. <sup>2</sup> Bless the LORD, O my soul, and do not forget all God's benefits— <sup>3</sup> who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases.

Romans 14:1 - 12 (NRSV) Welcome those who are weak in faith, but not for the purpose of quarreling over opinions. <sup>2</sup>Some believe in eating anything, while the weak eat only vegetables. <sup>3</sup>Those who eat must not despise those who abstain, and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat; for God has welcomed them. <sup>4</sup>Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another? It is before their own lord that they stand or fall. And they will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make them stand. <sup>5</sup>Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike.
