TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

Psalm 111:1 - 10 (NRSV) Praise the LORD! I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation. ²Great are the works of the LORD, studied by all who delight in them. ³ Full of honor and majesty is GOD's work, and GOD's righteousness endures forever. GOD has gained renown by GOD's wonderful deeds; the LORD is gracious and merciful. ⁵ The LORD provides food for those who fear GOD; the LORD is ever mindful of GOD's covenant. ⁶ The LORD has shown GOD's people the power of GOD'S works, in giving them the heritage of the nations. ⁷ The works of GOD'S hands are faithful and just; all GOD's precepts are trustworthy. 8 They are established forever and ever, to be performed with faithfulness and uprightness. ⁹ The LORD sent redemption to GOD'S people; the LORD has commanded GOD's covenant forever. Mark 1:21 - 28 (NRSV) ²¹They went to Capernaum; and when the Sabbath came, he entered the synagogue and taught. ²²They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes. ²³Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, ²⁴and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." ²⁵But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" ²⁶And the unclean spirit, convulsing him and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. ²⁷They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one another, "What is this?
