## Psalm 22

- <sup>1</sup> My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
- <sup>2</sup> O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night, but find no rest.
- <sup>3</sup> Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- <sup>4</sup> In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- <sup>5</sup> To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.

- <sup>6</sup> But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people.
- <sup>7</sup> All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me, they shake their heads;
- <sup>8</sup> 'Commit your cause to the Lord; let the Lord deliver—let the Lord rescue the one in whom God delights!'
- <sup>9</sup> Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast.
- <sup>10</sup> On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God.
- <sup>11</sup> Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.

#### I Thessalonians 4:13-18

13 But we do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope. <sup>14</sup>For since we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so, through Jesus, God will bring with him those who have died. <sup>15</sup>For this we declare to you by the word of the Lord, that we who are alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will by no means precede those who have died. <sup>16</sup>For the Lord himself, with a cry of command, with the archangel's call and with the sound of God's trumpet, will descend from heaven, and the dead in Christ will rise first. <sup>17</sup>Then we who are alive, who are left, will be caught up in the clouds together with them to meet the Lord in the air; and so we will be with the Lord for ever. <sup>18</sup>Therefore encourage one another with these words.
