#### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:**

**Deuteronomy 8:11-20** <sup>11</sup>Take care that you do not forget the Lord your God, by failing to keep God's commandments, God's ordinances, and God's statutes, which I am commanding you today. <sup>12</sup>When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them, <sup>13</sup> and when your herds and flocks have multiplied, and your silver and gold is multiplied, and all that you have is multiplied, <sup>14</sup>then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, <sup>15</sup>who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid waste-land with poisonous snakes and scorpions. The LORD made water flow for you from flint rock, <sup>16</sup> and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good. <sup>17</sup>Do not say to yourself, 'My power and the might of my own hand have gained me this wealth.' <sup>18</sup>But remember the Lord your God, for it is the Lord who gives you power to get wealth, so that the Lord may confirm God's covenant that the Lord swore to your ancestors, as the Lord is doing today.<sup>19</sup>If you do forget the Lord your God and follow other gods to serve and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you shall surely perish.<sup>20</sup>Like the nations that the Lord is destroying before you, so shall you perish, because you would not obey the voice of the Lord your God.

**Matthew 6:1-4** <sup>1</sup>Concerning Almsgiving, your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven. <sup>2</sup>So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. <sup>3</sup>But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, <sup>4</sup>so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

**I Timothy 6:17-19**<sup>17</sup> As for those who in the present age are rich, command them not to be haughty, or to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but rather on God who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.<sup>18</sup>They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, <sup>19</sup>thus storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that really is life.

**Luke 6:34-36** <sup>34</sup>If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again.<sup>35</sup>But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for the Lord is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. <sup>36</sup>Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.
