### John 16:12-15 (NRSV)

<sup>12</sup> "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. <sup>13</sup> When the Spirit of truth comes, the Spirit will guide you into all the truth; for the Spirit will not speak on the Spirit's own, but will speak whatever the Spirit hears, and the Spirit will declare to you the things that are to come. <sup>14</sup> The Spirit will glorify me, because the Spirit will take what is mine and declare it to you. <sup>15</sup> All that the Lord has is mine. For this reason I said that the Spirit will take what is mine and declare it to you.

# Romans 5:1-5 (NRSV)

**5** Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, <sup>2</sup> through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.<sup>3</sup> And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, <sup>4</sup> and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, <sup>5</sup> and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.
