TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:

Isaiah 61: 1-4, 8-11

¹The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; the Lord has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; ² to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; ³ to provide for those who mourn in Zion— to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display God's glory. ⁴ They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. ⁸ For I the Lord love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them.

⁹ Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the Lord has blessed. ¹⁰ I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God; for God has clothed me with the garments of salvation, the Lord has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. ¹¹ For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

Luke 1: 46b-55

And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord, ⁴⁷ and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour, ⁴⁸ for the Lord has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant. Surely, from now on all generations will call me blessed; ⁴⁹ for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is God's name. ⁵⁰ God's mercy is for those who fear the Lord from generation to generation. ⁵¹ The Lord has shown strength with God's arm; the Lord has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. ⁵² The Lord has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly; ⁵³ God has filled the hungry with good things, and sent the rich away empty. ⁵⁴ The Lord has helped God's servant Israel, in remembrance of the Lord's mercy, ⁵⁵ according to the promise God made to our ancestors, to Abraham and to his descendants forever.'
