
### Luke 14: 12-24

<sup>12</sup> He said also to the one who had invited him, 'When you give a luncheon or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or rich neighbours, in case they may invite you in return, and you would be repaid. <sup>13</sup>But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. <sup>14</sup>And you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you, for you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.'

15 One of the dinner guests, on hearing this, said to him, 'Blessed is anyone who will eat bread in the kingdom of God!' <sup>16</sup>Then Jesus said to him, 'Someone gave a great dinner and invited many.<sup>17</sup>At the time for the dinner he sent his slave to say to those who had been invited, "Come; for everything is ready now." <sup>18</sup>But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said to him, "I have bought a piece of land, and I must go out and see it; please accept my apologies." <sup>19</sup>Another said, "I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to try them out; please accept my apologies." <sup>20</sup>Another said, "I have just been married, and therefore I cannot come."<sup>21</sup>So the slave returned and reported this to his master.
