## **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:**

**Numbers 11:24-30** <sup>24</sup> So Moses went out and told the people the words of the Lord; and he gathered seventy elders of the people, and placed them all around the tent. <sup>25</sup>Then the Lord came down in the cloud and spoke to him, and took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders; and when the spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do so again. <sup>26</sup> Two men remained in the camp, one named Eldad, and the other named Medad, and the spirit rested on them; they were among those registered, but they had not gone out to the tent, and so they prophesied in the camp. <sup>27</sup>And a young man ran and told Moses, 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' <sup>28</sup>And Joshua son of Nun, the assistant of Moses, one of his chosen men, \* said, 'My lord Moses, stop them!' <sup>29</sup>But Moses said to him, 'Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, and that the Lord would put God's spirit on them!' <sup>30</sup> And Moses and the elders of Israel returned to the camp.

John 7:37-39 <sup>37</sup> On the last day of the festival, the great day, while Jesus was standing there, he cried out, 'Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, <sup>38</sup> and let the one who believes in me drink. As the scripture has said, "Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water." <sup>39</sup> Now he said this about the Spirit, which believers in him were to receive; for as yet there was no Spirit, because Jesus was not yet glorified.
