#### **TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS:**

## Hosea 1:2-6

<sup>2</sup>When the Lord first spoke through Hosea, the Lord said to Hosea, 'Go, take for yourself a wife of whoredom and have children of whoredom, for the land commits great whoredom by forsaking the Lord.' <sup>3</sup>So he went and took Gomer daughter of Diblaim, and she conceived and bore him a son. 4 And the Lord said to him, 'Name him Jezreel; for in a little while I will punish the house of Jehu for the blood of Jezreel, and I will put an end to the kingdom of the house of Israel. <sup>5</sup>On that day I will break the bow of Israel in the valley of Jezreel.' 6 She conceived again and bore a daughter. Then the Lord said to him, 'Name her Lo-ruhamah, for I will no longer have pity on the house of Israel or forgive them.

#### Hosea 11:1-9

<sup>1</sup>When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. <sup>2</sup> The more I<sup>\*</sup> called them, the more they went from me; \* they kept sacrificing to the Baals, and offering incense to idols. <sup>3</sup> Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk, I took them up in my<sup>\*</sup> arms; but they did not know that I healed them. <sup>4</sup> I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love. I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks.\* I bent down to them and fed them. <sup>5</sup> They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me. <sup>6</sup> The sword rages in their cities, it consumes their oracle-priests, and devours because of their schemes. <sup>7</sup> My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call, but he does not raise them up at all.\* <sup>8</sup> How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, O Israel? How can I make you like Admah? How can I treat you like Zeboiim? My heart recoils within me; my compassion grows warm and tender. <sup>9</sup> I will not execute my fierce anger; I will not again destroy Ephraim; for I am God and no mortal, the Holy One in your midst, and I will not come in wrath.

<sup>1</sup>Return, O Israel, to the Lord your God, for you have stumbled because of your iniquity. <sup>2</sup> Take words with you and return to the Lord; say to the Lord, 'Take away all guilt; accept that which is good, and we will offer the fruit of our lips.

<sup>4</sup> I will heal their disloyalty; I will love them freely, for my anger has turned from them. <sup>5</sup> I will be like the dew to Israel; he shall blossom like the lily, he shall strike root like the forests of Lebanon.
