

Mennonite Church Canada is connected with several Anabaptist church groups in Chile including the Evangelical Mennonite Church of Chile and the Puerta del Rebaño congregation. Titus and Karen Guenther (Charleswood Mennonite Church, Wpg.) have served in Chile through short-term teaching assignments with Mennonite Church Canada, most recently in 2013.

*Sunday School Christmas Giving Project: This Christmas, we can give the Gift of Food to People Affected by the War in Syria through the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. A donation of \$13.50 will provide food for one person for a month through the Foodgrains Bank, and we will hang a CFGB ornament for each person helped. All donations for people affected by the Syrian crisis will be matched 4:1 by the Canadian government. Donations are also matched dollarfor-dollar by the Canadian government through its new Syria Emergency Relief Fund, up until December 31. A donation of \$13.50 will provide a total of \$81—\$67.50 for the Foodgrains Bank (enough for food for five people), and an additional \$13.50 for the government's Syria Emergency Relief Fund, which will dispense money to Canadian NGOs to help people affected by that conflict. A giving jar will be in the foyer or donations can be designated for Sunday School CFGB project through your offering.

*General fund receipts for the five Sundays of November were \$12,321.30 bringing our total for 2015 to \$134,121.38. This is 89.1% of our approved budget for the year after 91.5% of the year has passed. Thank you for your continuing support of our church's ministry.



*Osler Mennonite Church members have been looking for a while into the possibility of **sponsoring a refugee family**. At a meeting in September, 5 church members said they would be willing to join a committee, and nearly 20 indicated ways in which they could help. Since then, we have been made aware of a home in the city, suitable for a small family, which the owner has offered to rent at a very reasonable rate, cutting the cost of a year's support from about \$27,000 to possibly less than \$20,000. MCC has offered to connect us with other people in the city who are keen to help. The committee has begun to meet to build some plans for refugee sponsorship - but the final approval for this needs to come from the congregation as a whole. **We will meet briefly after the service on Dec. 20th** to hear and vote on the committee's proposal. Then the group can know whether they can quickly move ahead.

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Luke 1:26-45

26 In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, ²⁷to a virgin engaged to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸And he came to her and said, 'Greetings, favoured one! The Lord is with you. 29 But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰The angel said to her, 'Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favour with God. ³¹And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³²He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end.' ³⁴Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be, since I am a virgin?' ³⁵The angel said to her, 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son; and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷For nothing will be impossible with God.' ³⁸Then Mary said, 'Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her. 39 In those days Mary set out and went with haste to a Judean town in the hill country, 40 where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. 41When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit ⁴² and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. ⁴³And why has this happened to me that the mother of my Lord comes to me? ⁴⁴For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy. ⁴⁵And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'
