*Willard Metzger's passion for climate justice and his respected participation in Canadian ecumenical bodies has garnered him an invitation to attend the United Nations Framework Climate Change Conference, Nov. 30 – Dec. 11, 2015, Paris, France. Willard Metzger is Mennonite Church Canada Executive Director and a CCC vice-president.
