TODAY'S SCRIPTURE LESSONS: Acts 18:22-28

22 When he had landed at Caesarea, he went up to Jerusalem and greeted the church, and then went down to Antioch. ²³After spending some time there he departed and went from place to place through the region of Galatia and Phrygia, strengthening all the disciples. 24 Now there came to Ephesus a Jew named Apollos, a native of Alexandria. He was an eloquent man, well-versed in the scriptures. ²⁵He had been instructed in the Way of the Lord; and he spoke with burning enthusiasm and taught accurately the things concerning Jesus, though he knew only the baptism of John. ²⁶He began to speak boldly in the synagogue; but when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained the Way of God to him more accurately. ²⁷And when he wished to cross over to Achaia, the believers encouraged him and wrote to the disciples to welcome him. On his arrival he greatly helped those who through grace had become believers, ²⁸ for he powerfully refuted the Jews in public, showing by the scriptures that the Messiah is Jesus.

*A brief update on MCC's Refugee Response from Mennonite Central Committee: MCC response in the region

- MCC has programmed over \$31 million in response for the Syria crisis in Syria, Lebanon and Jordan since February 2012 and Iraq since June 2014.
- This is MCC's largest disaster response in our history.
- Since 2012, MCC has sent 52 material resources shipments containing comforters, hygiene and relief kits and school kits to Syria, Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq.
- The focus of MCC's response to the crisis continues to be on humanitarian assistance (food assistance, household items, clothing and shelter), and psychosocial support and peacebuilding initiatives.
- The Canadian Government Department of Foreign Affairs (DFATD) has contributed \$6.9 million for MCC's humanitarian assistance and peacebuilding in the region.
- MCC supports access to education for IDPs and refugees in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq.
