TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Galatians 5:13-25

13 For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters; only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love become slaves to one another. ¹⁴For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself.' ¹⁵If, however, you bite and devour one another, take care that you are not consumed by one another.

16 Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh. ¹⁷For what the flesh desires is opposed to the Spirit, and what the Spirit desires is opposed to the flesh; for these are opposed to each other, to prevent you from doing what you want. ¹⁸But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not subject to the law. ¹⁹Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, ²⁰idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, ²¹envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

22 By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, ²³gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. ²⁴And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. ²⁵If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit.

REGARDING SEMI – ANNUAL MEETING:

At Monday night's semi-annual meeting there were three items on the agenda which required a vote. We did not have a quorum, so were unable to ask for a vote. So we discussed the items, made motions to approve them, and will have a congregational meeting after the service on Sunday, July 3 to vote. The items are as follows:

1. **Proposed constitutional changes on Membership.** These changes have already been presented to the congregation.

Membership -p.2

Proposed change:

Persons who are members of another congregation, including one which practices infant baptism, may be accepted after taking part in catechism or church membership instruction. This includes persons who choose to continue to hold membership in another congregation and thus hold dual membership. It is our desire that all persons receive believer's baptism.

Associate Members -p. 3 and 4

Proposed change:

Persons who accept our statement of faith and are interested in being part of the fellowship and work of this church but who have not been baptized as infants nor yet chosen to receive believer's baptism can be instated as Associate Members. They have full voting powers except where the revision of the constitution is involved. Associate Members may serve on standing committees, but may not hold positions represented on Church Council. The process of becoming an Associate Member is the same as that of becoming a full member. Persons who are eligible for full membership but opt to remain as Associate Members may do so.

- 2. Amendments to 2016 Budget for Osler Mennonite Church. With the hiring of Terri Lynn Paulson as Pastor of Faith and Community, the amounts under Associate Pastor Salary, EI, CPP, WCB, Conference Pension, Group and Dental Insurance, Pastor Education, Pastor Travel and Incidentals, and Office Supplies needed to be adjusted. The budget will be increased from \$170,087 to \$177,221.
- 3. **Student Bursary Fund.** A Bursary Fund was created when Cornelius Boldt donated a sum of money to OMC to be used by students who attend a Mennonite school. It was decided at that time that a one-time bursary of \$500 would be available to any student wishing to attend a Mennonite school.

Proposed change:

Make \$500 available to students wishing to attend a Mennonite high school, and \$500 available to students wishing to attend a Mennonite post secondary school. (This would allow a student to access this bursary twice).

The Student Bursary Fund is not a closed fund. People are able to donate to this fund at any time to replenish it. Should the fund become depleted, we will not be able to give out any bursaries. There is approximately \$3,000 in the fund at present.
