TODAY'S SCRIPTURES: Ephesians 3:14-21 (First Nations Version)

This is the reason I bow down on my knees and humble myself before the Great Creator above, from whom all families, clans and tribes, in this world and in the world above, are named. This is my prayer for you: that from the great treasures of beauty, Creator will gift you with the Spirit's mighty power and strengthen you in your inner being. In this way, the Chosen One will make his home in your heart. I pray that as you trust in the Chosen One, your roots will go deep into the soil of his great love, and that from these roots you will draw the strength and courage needed to walk this sacred path together with all his holy people. This path of love is higher than the stars, deeper than the great waters, wider than the sky. Yes, this loves comes from and reaches to all the directions. I pray that you would feel how deep the Chosen One's great love is - a love that goes beyond our small and weak ways of thinking. This love fills us with the Great Spirit - the one who fills all things. I am praying to the Maker of Life who, by great power working in us, can do far more than what we ask for, more than our small minds can imagine. May the Sacred Family and the Chosen One bring honor to the Maker across all generations, to the time beyond the end of all days. Aho!

Sermon reflection questions:

- 1. How does the Indigenous community's struggle between traditional spirituality and Christianity reflect our own modern day Mennonite struggle with our faith?
- 2. Does Steven Charleston's Native American view of Genesis, Exodus, the Prophets and the Exile make sense? How might it refresh our own understanding of the Old Testament?
- 3. Does Steven Charleston's Native American view of Jesus as Messiah and his four vision quests make sense? How might it refresh our own understanding of Jesus?
- 4. How might vision quests of solitude, fasting and prayer help us as Mennonites? Are there ways we already do that?
