# NEWS from MC Sask: Indigenous-Settler Relations Digitizing Indian Day School Records

When the Truth and Reconciliation Commission released their Calls to Action in 2015, they invited "community archives to work collaboratively with the National Centre for Truth and Reconciliation (NCTR) to... collect copies of all records relevant to the history and legacy of the residential school system" (Call #77). Mennonite Church Canada did not run any residential schools, but were invited by two communities to establish Days schools in the 1950s and 60s, of which we have some archival records that tell some of this story. The TRC notes that the kinds of concerns identified with residential schools were often present in the day school system. Therefore, seeking the spirit of Call to Action #77, Mennonite Church Canada and Mennonite Heritage Archives are in the process of digitizing our day school records. Our hope is to gift these records to the NCTR this fall.
