TODAY'S SCRIPTURE: Mark 4:35-41 Jesus Stills a Storm

35 On that day, when evening had come, he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side.' ³⁶And leaving the crowd behind, they took him with them in the boat, just as he was. Other boats were with him. ³⁷A great gale arose, and the waves beat into the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped. ³⁸But he was in the stern, asleep on the cushion; and they woke him up and said to him, 'Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?' ³⁹He woke up and rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, 'Peace! Be still!' Then the wind ceased, and there was a dead calm. ⁴⁰He said to them, 'Why are you afraid? Have you still no faith?' And they were filled with great awe and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?'

These mountain people are subsistence farmers mostly and are treated lower than "second-class citizens" in Laos and Thailand. Tom said that in his recent visit to a village of the Blu people, he saw a need for water – more wells to be dug; more adequate sanitation given that there are many sanitation-related diseases and for prayer, these mountain people are persecuted and treated as outsiders, even as criminals. Tom and Christine have a heart for sharing Christ with the Blu people and already envisioning how they can mobilize other Christians and organizations to provide some of the basic human needs of these people. Please pray along with the Poovongs for the Blu mountain people and for this new opportunity to demonstrate the love of God.
