Pastor's Note:

There are numerous reasons to be active and involved in a church. In addition to the necessity of corporately worshipping God, the opportunity to learn and grow theological and spiritually, and satisfying the call to serve others, there is also the benefits of being in a loving faith community. I often tell those who are struggling and feeling alone in a hostile world to join a church, just to be in a supportive community. We need each other more than we realize.

Our church provides a wonderful environment for children and youth to risk, to be nurtured and educated and to be affirmed and loved by adults. Moreover, adults have the opportunity to connect with the young, and in so doing sense the beauty of youthful adventure, and in the process learn new ways to be compassionate and patient. Our mentoring program and organized children activities are obvious points to plug in, and so is the sanctuary, foyer, the gathering room or the multipurpose room. Children and adults interacting in a safe and enhancing manner is part of the church community.

Church, also provides adults with a safe place to be "real"—to intimately share concerns, struggles and celebrations, and of course, good food. Through the church, adults can apply their passions and talents in meaningful and helpful ways that are not possible in the secular domain. Each person has place; a place and purpose orchestrated by God. Each of us is contributing, in community, to being the body of Christ. Each person is valued, needed and appreciated. In addition, one of the most significant advantages to being in a church community is participating in the power of prayer. Make praying for each person in our church part of your daily prayers. If praying for everyone in one day is too much, then organize the list, and try to pray for each person, at least once a week. We grow and learn a lot through prayer, and God responds to our prayers, too.

### **Mennonite Church Canada – Ministry Highlights**

Last month's newsletter shared some of the work that Mennonite Church Canada does. We told you some ways MCC is dedicated to working for peace and justice, caring for creation, healing relationships with Canada's First Nations, and extending compassion and hospitality to newcomers and those of other faith traditions. Here are some more ways that Mennonite Church Canada, a church-building, faith-nurturing body, a community of over 225 congregations represented by five area churches, serves many peoples.

- 1. Church Matters, a radio and podcast program heard by over 20,000 listeners over the airwaves and several thousand more via the internet, explores why the church matters in the world today, through interviews with guests and story tellers from a variety of backgrounds and perspectives. In 2012, Mennonite Church Canada celebrated the fifth anniversary of Church Matters with more than 72 episodes produced to date. <a href="https://www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/1893">www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/1893</a>
- 2. As of October 31, 2012, two thousand electronic resources created by the national church office and by congregations across the country were downloaded for a record total of 104,000 times from Mennonite Church Canada's Resource Centre. Almost 3300 books, DVDs, curricula and other materials were circulated to individuals and congregations across Canada. This circulation represents a 15% increase over 2011. http://resources.mennonitechurch.ca/Home.
- 3. The Faith and Life Committee of Mennonite Church Canada shaped *Dusting off the Bible for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century*, the 2012 Study Assembly, with a focus on equipping the church with tools to be a discerning body in today's world. Many Assembly 2012 delegates and participants were appreciative of the format as a study session, the facility used, and the accomodations. - 4. Delegates to Assembly 2012 approved Being a Faithful Church 4 for study. Newly developed tools are available to help stimulate further thought and discussion on this topic: www.mennonitechchurch.ca/tiny/1947
- 5. Your donations are helping to support a growing ethnic and cultural diversity with a growing body of multilingual resources: <a href="www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/1924">www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/1924</a>. Each Sunday, Mennonite Church Canada congregations worship in over 15 different languages.
- 6. Eight church members from across Mennonite Church Canada joined the Faith and Life Committee for a season of prayer and "Listening to what the Spirit is saying" to our church today so that we can continue to be a faithful church in a time of great change. We are inspired by the deep faith and commitment of these members.
- 7. The Mennonite Heritage Center Gallery relies totally on donations, and in 2012 those gifts brought six exhibits to life. Curator and artist Fay Dirks says that one of the most highly publicized exhibits, Indescribably It is about Murder, generated strong responses from those who saw it and it received national media attention. The gallery provokes thought through art that explores peace and justice issues and inherent human dignity. www.mennonitechurch.ca/programs/gallery/
- 8. Organizers are preparing to host hundreds of youth for the Fat Calf Festival (aka Mennonite Church Canada 2013 Youth Assembly) at Camp Assiniboia, just outside of Winnipeg. #### \*Invitation to Join Mennonite Church Canada's 2013 UK Learning Tour (August 21 – September 2)

As shown by the success of Stuart Murray's *The Naked Anabaptist*, there is much that Mennonites in Canada can learn from the British experience with post-Christendom. This August, Mennonite Church Canada is offering a unique study-focused learning tour to the UK, where we will meet with leaders of the UK Anabaptist Network to discuss new ways of being church and how Anabaptism can help revitalize the global church of the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The tour will include three days at Greenbelt, an annual Christian Arts Festival featuring talks by leading Anabaptist and Emerging Church voices.

Leading the tour will be Willard Metzger, Executive Director of Mennonite Church Canada, and Vic Thiessen, our Chief Administrative Officer and Executive Minister, Church Engagement (who was the Director of the London Mennonite Centre from 2002 – 2009).

The cost of the tour (\$2222) <u>includes</u> twelve nights of accommodation (mostly in single rooms), transportation within the UK, Greenbelt registration and half of your meals (including a full English breakfast each morning). You will also receive a \$300 donation receipt.

Only six spaces remain (total of twelve participants plus the leaders), so register early (deadline is April 15, 2013).
