OMC Sunday School Christmas Giving Project

This year the project chosen by the Education Committee for our annual Christmas Giving Project is MCC's "Supporting People Caught in Crisis" in Syria.

Due to the violence and unrest in Syria, families are leaving their homes, sometimes with only a suitcase and the clothes on their backs.

Our support through MCC can provide emergency assistance through shipments of school kits, relief kits and comforters. Vital items such as medicines, milk powder and diapers are purchased locally, and financial support is needed to buy them. MCC also supports 'Caritas Jordan' where Syrians can register as refugees, enroll children in an afterschool program and receive material resources.

A giving jar will be placed in the church foyer for the Advent season and you may place donations there, or designate gifts made through the offering as for: "Christmas Giving Project: MCC Syria".
