O, the mystery of God's dwelling!

Our Advent theme is a statement about God's profound act of entering the human world, and it also reflects our

confusion and frustration from trying to make sense of this stupendous event.

To better grasp the Christmas season, Advent is designed to be a penitential season, instead of a frantic shopping season that ends on the 25th. Each Sunday, through to Epiphany, we will progress in exploring the mystery, as penitence peals away the barriers to understanding.

The themes for each Sunday are:

Advent One: O, the mystery of God's dwelling in our present! Advent Two: O, the mystery of God's dwelling in our relationships! Advent Three: O, the mystery of God's dwelling in transformation! Advent Four: O, the mystery of God's dwelling in the child that is born!

*Sunday, December 22nd will be our choir Christmas presentation during the worship service.

***The Christmas Eve Children's pageant and Candlelight service** is at 7:00 pm on Tuesday, December 24th.

*Sunday, December 29 will also include our Year End Celebration.

Pastor's Note:

The congregational discussion, on Sunday, November 24th, was about the youth ministry opportunity. We have over twenty youth connected with our youth group, of which over half do not regularly attend church. Teenagers face many challenges and influences, some far greater than their ability to properly discern, without help. To effectively respond to this opportunity, to inspire the youth to thrive and survive, we would need to hire a halftime youth pastor; however, we face two important considerations. One, is to determine whether God is calling our church to this ministry. Churches and those who care have an overwhelming array of needs to respond to; selection is the only alternative. Secondly, without a miracle, we simply cannot afford to hire a halftime youth pastor. Therefore, both considerations require prayer. What is God calling us to do and be, and will we allow the miracle to happen? I invite all of you to pray about this. Please ask God what we should do, and ask how you can be a part of that calling.

\*"Did I remember to put a cheque in the offering last month?" -An Opportunity to Simplify and Standardize Your Giving People attending our church have, from time to time, asked about making regular donations in a simpler way – like direct bank withdrawals or even regular credit card payments. A few people have chosen to provide post-dated cheques to the treasurer, which is certainly an option open at any time. When we've looked into options in the past it seemed that most of them carried a significant cost so we didn't pursue them. A recent discussion with Affinity Credit Union (where the church has its accounts), however, has determined that the direct withdrawal option could be introduced without excessive cost. They indicated that a system known as CAFT is a very low risk (i.e. very secure site) system and can be set up so the cost (to the church) is quite reasonable. To keep the cost down the withdrawals would be regular (likely once a month) and on the same day for everyone involved (say the first Monday of each month). Set up in that way the cost to the church would be a \$50 initial set-up fee, \$1.00 per month for the monthly group file and 25 cents per individual transaction. The required set-up is fairly simple and changes can be made at any time with no cost.

If this sounds like an option that would interest you, please contact the church treasurer, Jim Dyck (phone 306-239-2205, email dyck.mj@gmail.com or leave a note in his church mailbox) to indicate your interest. If there is enough interest to justify setting this up, Jim will contact you to get the necessary information. Please consider whether this would be helpful in managing your stewardship.

## **A Requested Potluck Recipe**

## **Ruby Red Salad**

1 (3 oz) package of raspberry flavored Jell-O mix
2 cups boiling water
1 (10 oz) package frozen raspberries
1 pint sour cream
1 (3 oz) package cherry flavored Jell-O
1 (8 oz) can crushed pineapple, drained
1 (16 oz) can whole cranberry sauce

Dissolve raspberry gelatin in 1 cup hot water. Add frozen raspberries and stir until well mixed. Pour into a glass bowl. Refrigerate until almost firm, about 30 to 60 minutes.

Spread sour cream over firm gelatine. Refrigerate.

Dissolve cherry gelatin in 1 cup hot water. Stir in crushed pineapple and cranberry sauce. Chill until partially set, about 20 to 40 minutes.

Spoon cherry gelatin mixture over sour cream layer. Chill until firm, another hour or two.

**Prepare Ye the Way: Advent** 

Advent, from the Latin adventus, means "coming". It is a time of selfexamination and prayer; a time set aside to prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth. The Advent wreath is an adaptation of an ancient practice that dates back to pre-Christian times. Candles were lighted around a wheel during the festival of the winter solstice to celebrate the return of gradually lengthening daylight. The symbolism of this ceremony takes on an entirely new meaning for us in the form of the Advent wreath as we anticipate the birth of Christ and the enlightenment His coming brings to our lives. A candle is lit each Sunday of Advent, and centre Christ candle is lit. Advent serves to remind us what Christmas is all about. It stands juxtaposed and in contrast to the commercialized Christmas.

## A Christmas Pageant Story

Each December, I vowed to make Christmas a calm and peaceful experience. But once again, despite my plans, chaos prevailed. I had cut back on nonessential obligations-- extensive card writing, endless baking, decorating, and yes, even the all American pastime, overspending. Yet, still, I found myself exhausted, unable to appreciate the precious family\_moments, and, of course, the true meaning of Christmas. My son, Nicholas, was in kindergarten that year. It was an exciting season for a six year old filled with hopes, dreams and laughter. For weeks, he'd been memorizing songs for his school's "Winter Pageant." I didn't have the heart to tell him I'd be working the night of the production.

Unwilling to miss his shining moment, I spoke with his teacher. She assured me there'd be a dress rehearsal the morning of the presentation. All parents unable to attend that evening were welcome to come then. Fortunately, Nicholas seemed happy with the compromise. So, just as I promised, on the morning of the dress rehearsal, I filed in 10 minutes early, found a spot on the cafeteria floor and sat down. Around the room, I saw several other parents quietly scampering to their seats. As I waited, the students were led into the room. Each class, accompanied by their teacher, sat crosslegged on the floor. Then, each group, one by one, rose to perform their song.

Because the public school system had long stopped referring to the holiday as "Christmas," I didn't expect anything other than fun, commercial entertainment -- songs of reindeer, Santa Claus, snowflakes and good cheer. The melodies were fun, cute and lighthearted, but nowhere to be found was even the hint of an innocent babe, a manger, or Christ's sacred gift of hope and joy. So, when my son's class rose to sing, "Christmas Love", I was slightly taken aback by its bold title.

Nicholas was aglow, as were all of his classmates, adorned in fuzzy mittens, red sweaters and bright snowcaps upon their heads. Those in the front row -- center stage -- held up large letters, one by one, to spell out the title of the song. As the class would sing "C is for Christmas," a child would hold up the letter C. Then, "H is for Happy," and on and on, until each child holding up his portion had presented the complete message, "Christmas Love."

The performance was going smoothly, until suddenly, we noticed her - a small, quiet girl in the front row who was holding the letter "M" upside down. She was entirely unaware, that reversed, her letter "M" appeared as a "W." Fidgeting from side to side, she soon moved entirely away from her mark.

The audience of 1st through 6th graders snickered at the little one's mistake. But in her innocence, she had no idea they were laughing at her as she stood tall, proudly holding her "W".

One can only imagine the difficulty in calming an audience of young, giggling students. Although many teachers tried to shush the children, the laughter continued until the last letter was raised, and we all saw it together. A hush came over the audience and eyes began to widen. In that instant, we understood -- the reason we were there, why we celebrated the holiday in the first place, why even in the chaos there was a purpose for our festivities. For when the last letter was held high, the message read loud and clear:

CHRIST WAS LOVE. (And He still is and always will be!) -Author Unknown

MEDA will test models that can be assembled with local available components and easily used by women from varying locations and agricultural yields. Commercial suppliers will offer demonstrations and introductory discounts to stimulate early adoption, strengthening both supply and demand.

If women farmers in Northern Ghana can raise food, specifically vegetables and legumes, during the dry season they can improve their families' nutrition and earn income to buy supplemental food, cover health, education and household costs. With low-cost, appropriate and effective systems readily available, women farmers can harvest water during the rainy season, store it and use efficient yet simple irrigation mechanisms for dry season cultivation.

Grand Challenges Explorations (GCE) funds individuals worldwide to explore ideas that can break the mold in how we solve persistent global health and development challenges. MEDA's project is one of more than 80 Grand Challenges Explorations Round 11 grants announced today by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.
