LENT TO EASTER 2013 Ashamed no more

In our Western culture we are convertible openly dealing with judgment and guilt, yet we rarely discuss the issues of shame and honour. The logical, mathematical side (judgment and guilt) addresses our cognitive concerns, but not our emotional, feeling domain. We need salvation from the disgrace we may suffer, and we need to have our sense of honour and respect restored, too. Out Lenten theme contend with the redemption from shame.

Each Sunday will connect to the general theme with a more focussed message, and the music and visuals will reflect each Sunday's variation. There will not be a consistent visual or musical theme, and the children's time will be formed/selected by the person presenting the story.

To assist in your worship preparation, here are some questions for further reflection:

Lent One

We enter this Lenten season needing "salvation from the disgrace we suffer and the need to have our honor restored". What are the disgraces we suffer? How do we want God to restore us?

Lent Two

Have we given up hope that God will answer our prayers? Are we ashamed that our prayers have not been answered yet?

Lent Three

What or who do we desire? Are we thirsting after God? Are we at peace with God?

Lent Four

Are we experiencing joy? Do we have areas in our lives that we need to confess and receive forgiveness?

Lent Five

What does living the freedom of Christ look like? Do our lives reflect this freedom?

Lent Six/Palm Sunday

Do we trust God enough to transform our shame into honor?

Easter Sunday

God has made all things new. We are restored to honor – can we believe this after the Easter celebrations?
