#### Pastor's Note:

#### The Pro and the Priest

A church pastor wears numerous hats, including professional clergy and theologian, orator, administrator, counsellor and priest. The training and experience can greatly benefit these and other church activities, and therefore by constant association, the actions can become part of the pastor's identity and purpose. This "role" designation and expectation can cause confusion when the model of "priesthood of believers" is embraced. Who is supposed to do what becomes perplexing. A couple years ago, MC Sask. pastors discussed their roles and expectations. It was important to all pastors to believe that they were faithfully doing ministry, in the context of the church, just as everyone else was. Aside from their training and skills, the only difference between a pastor and lay person was that the pastor has the luxury to do such ministry full time. The pastors believed that each person in the church contributes and is responsible for the various church ministries. We are all priests; some just have more time to do "priest" than others. Moreover, most of the pastors found the suggestion that pastors are simply employees hired to do what others don't want to do quite disheartening. That concept devalued the pastors' understanding of calling, faithfulness and unity in being followers of Christ together.

One area of misunderstanding that sometimes arises from forgetting the concept of priesthood of believers is visitation. Visitation is a vital ministry in the church, a ministry that invites community participation. Here is a limited analogy: if our child is very sick, we won't hesitate to take him to the doctor because the doctor has skills and knowledge that can help him. However, we don't abandon him to the doctor. Parental nurturing, attention and love are just as important to the healing process. The ill child needs a community, including the pharmacist and neighbours, to help him get better. Likewise, I am often called in a crisis situation, and it is a priority of mine to visit as soon as possible. I can offer my help, tapping my experience, and I can offer other resources, too. Plus, I have a flexible schedule that allows me to quickly respond. Another visitation priority of mine is "lost sheep"--those who have drifted away. I am very concerned about them. Both types of visits, crisis

and lost sheep, are part of the ministry of the church, and not just by the pastor, and so are pastoral care visits. There is another type of church visit and that is the casual visit, when there is no pressing need involved. This category is low on my list, in part because I assume that active members are just like me--able and engaged in ministry, too. There is something to be said about visiting to build community; however, I think that is best done by the community--all visiting each other in the pursuit of community building. Nevertheless, some people would appreciate a visit from the pastor, and I need to know who they or you are. I would gladly come to your place and drink your coffee, but I don't want to intrude or take up your time, if you don't desire a visit from me. So, please let me know if you want a visit from me or from someone else in the church, because we are all priests doing the best we can.
