Senior High Retreat ... As I have mentioned before, I am really excited about this year's theme and speaker. Cory Funk is young adult originally from Manitoba with a passion for this year's theme, Sharing the Well: Faith and Diversity in a time of Fear and Division. He grew up being involved in Manitoba's MMYO youth retreats and events. and is really looking forward to getting right in there and interacting with our youth all through-out the weekend, and not just in session times. And if that weren't enough, I want to share with you the following background information, which is what really got me excited: "I was born and raised in Winnipeg, MB, I graduated Westgate Mennonite Collegiate and then went to the University of Winnipeg and got a BA in History (mainly of the Middle East) and Religious Studies (where I studied Islam and Arabic). I am now a Masters student at Memorial University of Newfoundland, where I'm writing my thesis on Islam and how Canadian Muslims express their religion on the Internet. On the side I'm also a research assistant where I'm helping do research on Muslim Minorities in Canada as well as Muslim Women's use of Hijab and Nigab. And just in case anyone is wondering why I'm studying Islam, in short, it's because I believe that part of loving your neighbor is taking the time to gain a nuanced understanding of them and their culture, and in this day and age Muslims are the neighbor that we need to get to know a lot better, because the absence of love is causing a lot of fear. And I study this so that I can share what I learn with others as well. Possible session topics: Session one: Good, Bad, or Different? The Importance of Perspective in

Christianity

Session two: Islam 101: Discussing our differences and casting aside common misconceptions

Session three: Stories and Faces: Hearing from Canadian Muslims Session four: Turning Knowledge into Love and Love into Action: Advocating with our Neighbor"

I think this retreat has a lot of potential for a positive impact here in Saskatchewan, so I encourage you to print the attached registration letter, start distributing it in mailboxes, and make sure your youth know this is a weekend they SHOULD NOT miss. Poster will be coming soon. Also, please note that in an effort to help make the retreat more accessible, youth can now request financial assistance from a Retreat Aid fund. If you have any questions, about the fund or other parts of the retreat, please let me know.
