Mennonite Church Canada – Ministry Highlights

In the pasts few newsletters, we shared some of the work that Mennonite Church Canada does. We told you some ways MCC is dedicated to working for peace and justice, caring for creation, healing relationships with Canada's First Nations, and extending compassion and hospitality to newcomers and those of other faith traditions. Here are a few more ways that Mennonite Church Canada, a church-building, faith-nurturing body, a community of over 225 congregations represented by five area churches, serves many peoples.

- 1. The church of the future needs to prepare leaders today if it is to flourish. With your donation dollars, Mennonite Church Canada engages in a number of activities and programs at home and abroad that teach, resource and encourage present leaders and invites and trains new leaders.
- 2. Did you know that your donation dollars help Mennonite Church Canada establish a variety of **resources to train up leadership** and help with church staff administrative tasks? Personnel committees can find information about everything from leadership training and continuing education resources to pastoral placement services, payroll guides and pension information at www.mennonite church.ca/tin/1925.
- 3. Thank you for supporting and encouraging young people in their quest for faith and leadership building experiences through **Mennonite Church Canada internships**. Last year, you provided financial support for internships. Last year, you provided financial support for the internships of Kaitlyn Wiebe (two months in Mexico); Daniel Paetkau (one year in South America); and Paul Dyck (one year in China).
- 4. Church Matters! That's the message delivered to tens of thousands of regular listeners in 12 episodes of the Church Matters radio broadcast and podcast produced in 2012. Listen to any of 72 episodes available via iTunes or at www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/1893.

- 5. In July 2012, 26 people went to Philadelphia, Mississippi (Choctaw Territory) with Mennonite Church Canada Indigenous Relations for Native Assembly, a gathering of Native Mennonite congregations from around North America. Thank you for helping Indigenous Relations play a leading role in this gathering facilitating worship, workshops, and bringing in three indigenous teachers (Cheryl Bear, Howard Jolly and Brander McDonald).
- 6. In September, eight young adult representatives from across Canada came to Winnipeg for a face-to-face meeting about the future of the church. A follow-up teleconference took place in November. Mennonite Church Canada leadership is discerning ways to bring young adults together for a much larger gathering. www.mennonitechurch.ca/tiny/1901.
- 7. In 2012, 40 videos were uploaded to **Mennonite Church Canada's YouTube channel** including a series that offers a behind the scenes look at your wider church ministry and staff. Shekinah Flood Update and Requests 2013 May 13, 2013

Dear Friends of Shekinah.

The flood waters hit Shekinah on April 29, 2013. Employees worked hard to save buildings, however devastating damage was done. The Chalet, shanty tents and the grounds all need extensive repairs.

We are still assessing the short term and long term financial impact of the damages. Not only do buildings need to be repaired but Shekinah had no choice but to cancel groups who had booked events. Therefore there is also significant loss of income. Important items to note – Flood insurance cannot be purchased. We are investigating aide from the Provincial Disaster Assistance Program, however there is no guarantee of approval. Shekinah was not on sound financial ground before the flood which has magnified the financial issues that lie before us.

On May 2, 2013 MDS (Mennonite Disaster Service) visited Shekinah to assess damages and offer help. They offered leadership and volunteers. Shekinah cannot express enough how helpful MDS has been in both the leadership of the clean-up, rebuilding and in the emotional support. A truly wonderful organization.

May 3rd and 4th, 2013 approximately 60 volunteers helped to remove all of the damaged materials from the Chalet and the Shanty tents. THANK YOU to all of these hard working volunteers. This hard work allowed the buildings to adequately dry out so we can now start rebuilding. MDS has agreed to help in the leadership of the rebuilding and Shekinah is required to assist in coordinating volunteers and pay for the materials that MDS will use to rebuild. We are estimating this cost to be at the minimum \$100,000.

The work is not complete, it's really just beginning! WE NEED YOUR HELP!
