Pastor's Note:

Summer Reading

The following are some findings from a recent study called "The Canadian Bible Engagement Study:

18% of Canadians agree that the Bible is God's word, down from 35% in 1996.

We are entering the post-Christian era. 69% of all Canadians agree Bible has irreconcilable contradictions. 50% of Christians agree, of which only 2% read the Bible regularly.

13 % think the Bible is relevant today; 23% of Christians think it is relevant.

11% of Canadians reflect on Scriptures at least once a week; 21 % of Christians do.

Only 11 % of Christians even talk about the Bible or messages from the Bible, outside of church.

*Confidence in the Bible greatly affects church attendance and religious devotion.

Evangelicals more strongly affirm the Bible at 43%; mainline Christians at 13% and Catholics at 11 %

What are your thoughts about the Bible? Have we relegated Bible reading to only the pastor, and if so, what does that say about "Priesthood of believers."

Here is a summer challenge: try reading the Bible through this summer, and if that seems too daunting, then just read the New Testament, the prophets, the Psalms, Genesis and Exodus. We Anabaptist believe that the Bible is a book for everyone, so let's practice what we believe. I dare you. Shekinah Retreat Centre "Summer Camp Connections"

The concept:

Each summer staff member will be paired with a camp connection (one person, or couple, if you'd rather) to make a specific pairing for the summer camp season (July & August). The camp connections are invited to keep their specific staff person in mind throughout the summer and show their care in a variety of ways.

Purpose:

The job of a summer camp counsellor is, at times, a demanding one. Camp counsellors can often feel burnt out at times, and as if their job is not important to those who are not physically at camp. The purpose of having a camp connection is to show the counsellors that they are personally supported by the larger community outside of camp. The hope is that with a small amount of communication and prayer, each counsellor will feel supported and connected to another person who they don't see on a daily basis during the summer) who cares for the camp program at Shekinah.

Requirements:

Please pray for your assigned counsellor, along with the work they're doing at Shekinah throughout the summer.

Please put together a card/letter or SMALL care package for your coun sellor to open on the first week of camp. These can be put together beforehand and mailed or given to the Summer Camp Director beforehand.

Suggestions for during the summer:

Sending letters or cards throughout the summer with encouraging words is an easy way to remind the counsellors that you are supporting and praying for them.

Counsellors always enjoy a snack during staff meeting. Receiving a small treat would probably brighten their day, no matter how stressful the week is.

You are invited to attend our Shekinah Camp Commissioning service to meet with your specific counsellor and see how the summer has started during our staff orientation week. Details to follow.

Any other small demonstration of appreciation you can think of... you can be creative (without distracting the staff from their job, of course!)
